8. Two Letters of Recommendation:

Two letters of recommendation must be submitted with this application to give judges a fuller picture of the nominee's academic and leadership accomplishments. One letter must be from a school official and the other letter from a supervisor or leader in reference to work/volunteer experience (paid, volunteer or charity work). Letters may be from persons on or off campus and should cite specific examples and why this nominee should be selected for this scholarship. Each letter should be no longer than one page with the typeface no smaller than 10-point.

9. Demonstration of SEVRAR Affiliate Scholarship Award (SASA):

Submit a personal essay describing why you should receive the SASA Scholarship based on your college and career goals. Please limit your essay to 1 page using a typeface no smaller than 10-point.
